This makeover was part of the work done in our recent **Development and Sustainability project**, which was funded by Highland Council Community Regeneration Funding. The project included a community consultation carried out by UHI, lots of discussion with local partners (such as Black Isle Men's Shed, local churches & health professionals), a review of how we promote our services and an environmental impact assessment. The information gained from this work has given us a clearer idea of how BIC services will be planned for the future. New developments include more group activities around the Black Isle, extension of the Meals at Home service to a wider area, development of a new volunteer team to offer more practical assistance to community members (details on p2!) and assist with getting clients to activities and further development of our community garden and sharing larder.

### **NEW VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITY**

BIC is creating a new team of general volunteers to help vulnerable members of the community with practical, everyday tasks. This exciting new development is one of the main outcomes of our recent development work was finding out what barriers and challenges people face in rural communities on the Black Isle. Well recognised issues such as lack of transport, need for accessible group activities to alleviate social isolation and better awareness of local services in the area were all highlighted. BIC already provides a range of support to people who find themselves isolated from their communities through health issues and lack of family or social connections. This new team of general volunteers will complement the existing BIC services and will enable them to develop much needed group activities in particular. General volunteers can help with a range of practical tasks such as shopping, DIY & gardening and transport to activities & appointments. The nature of volunteering is changing and it is recognised that people often want to put something back to their communities but have limited time due to their other commitments.



Becoming a BIC general volunteer is an ideal way of helping your community on an occasional and flexible basis.
